# PRINCIP Acts 27:9-1

#### PRINCIPLE # 12:

Acts 27:9-15 (NLT) <sup>9</sup>We had lost a lot of time. The weather was becoming dangerous for long voyages by then because it was so late in the fall, and Paul spoke to the ship's officers about it. <sup>10</sup> "Sirs," he said, "I believe there is trouble ahead if we go on – shipwreck, loss of cargo, injuries, and danger to our lives." <sup>11</sup> But the officer in charge of the prisoners listened more to

and danger to our lives." <sup>11</sup> But the officer in charge of the prisoners listened more to the ship's captain and the owner than to Paul. <sup>12</sup> And since Fair Havens was an exposed harbor – a poor place to spend the winter – most of the crew wanted to go to Phoenix, farther up the coast of Crete, and spend the winter there. Phoenix was a good harbor with only a southwest and northwest exposure. <sup>13</sup> When a light wind began blowing from the south, the sailors thought they could make it. So they pulled up anchor and sailed along close to shore. <sup>14</sup> But the weather changed abruptly, and a wind of typhoon strength (a "northeaster," they called it) caught the ship and blew it out to sea. <sup>15</sup> They couldn't turn the ship into the wind, so they gave up and let it run before the gale.
